

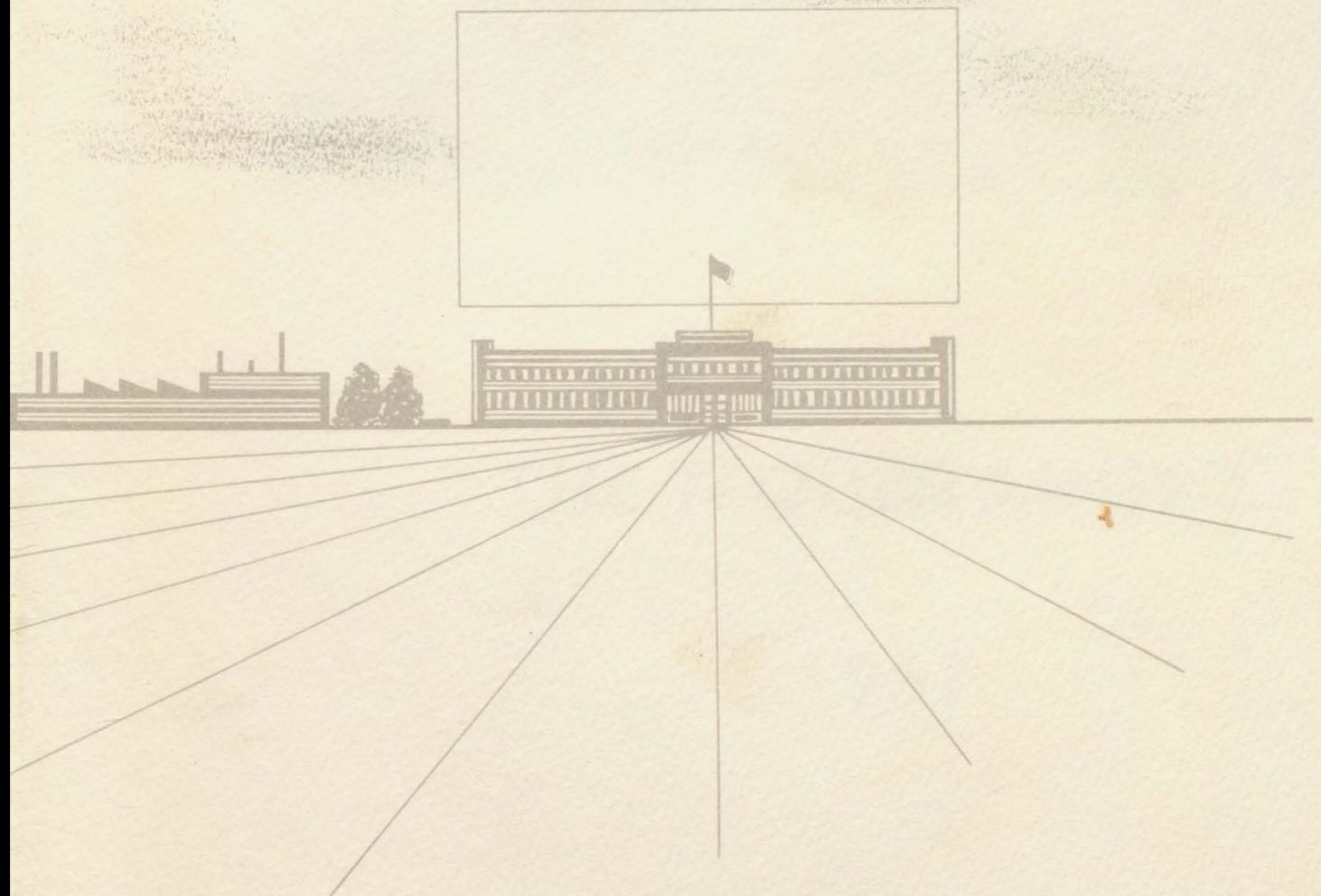


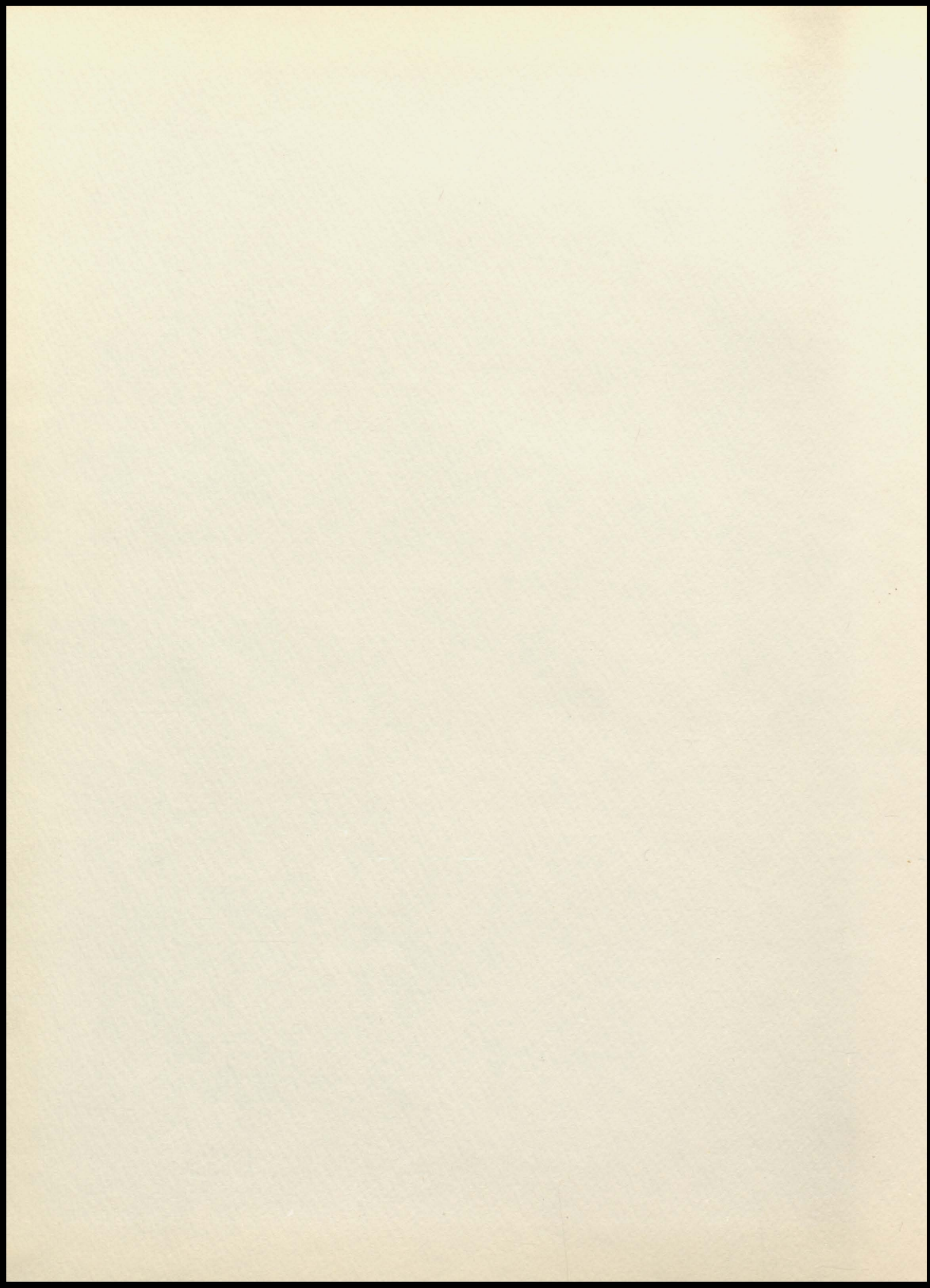

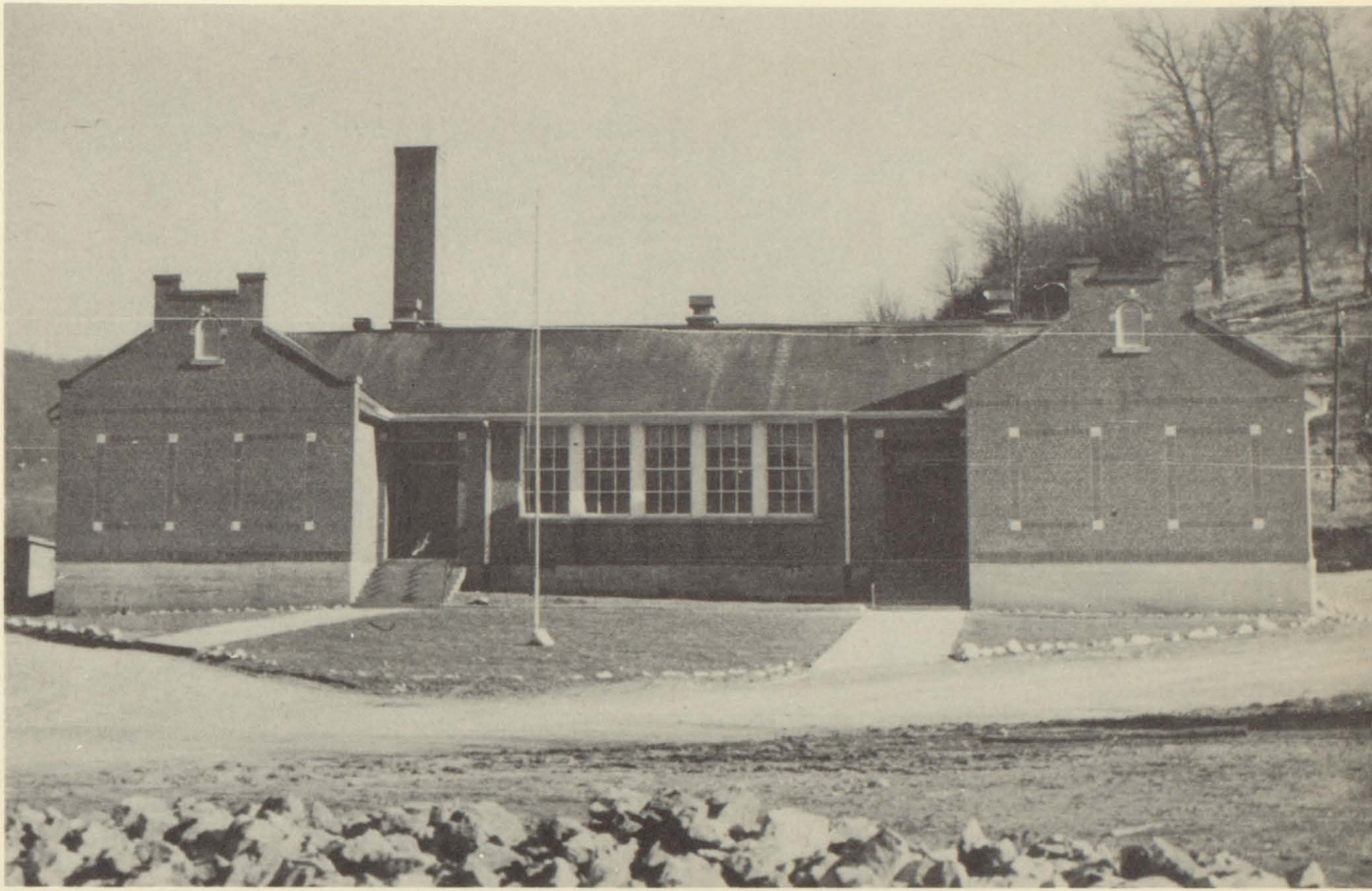

For his interest, ability and loyalty, we dedicate this annual to Curtis Wagner Tibbs.

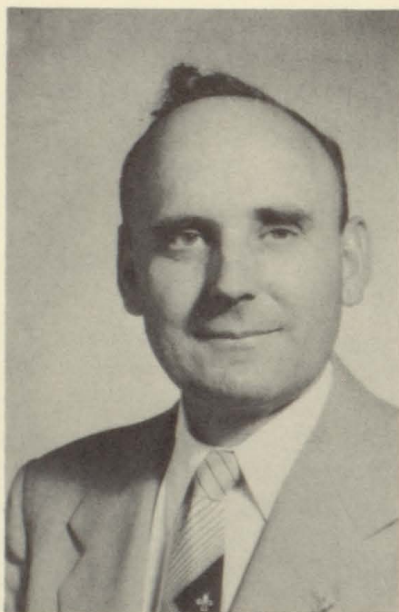

Andrew Cassell wills his basketball ability to Noel Peck.

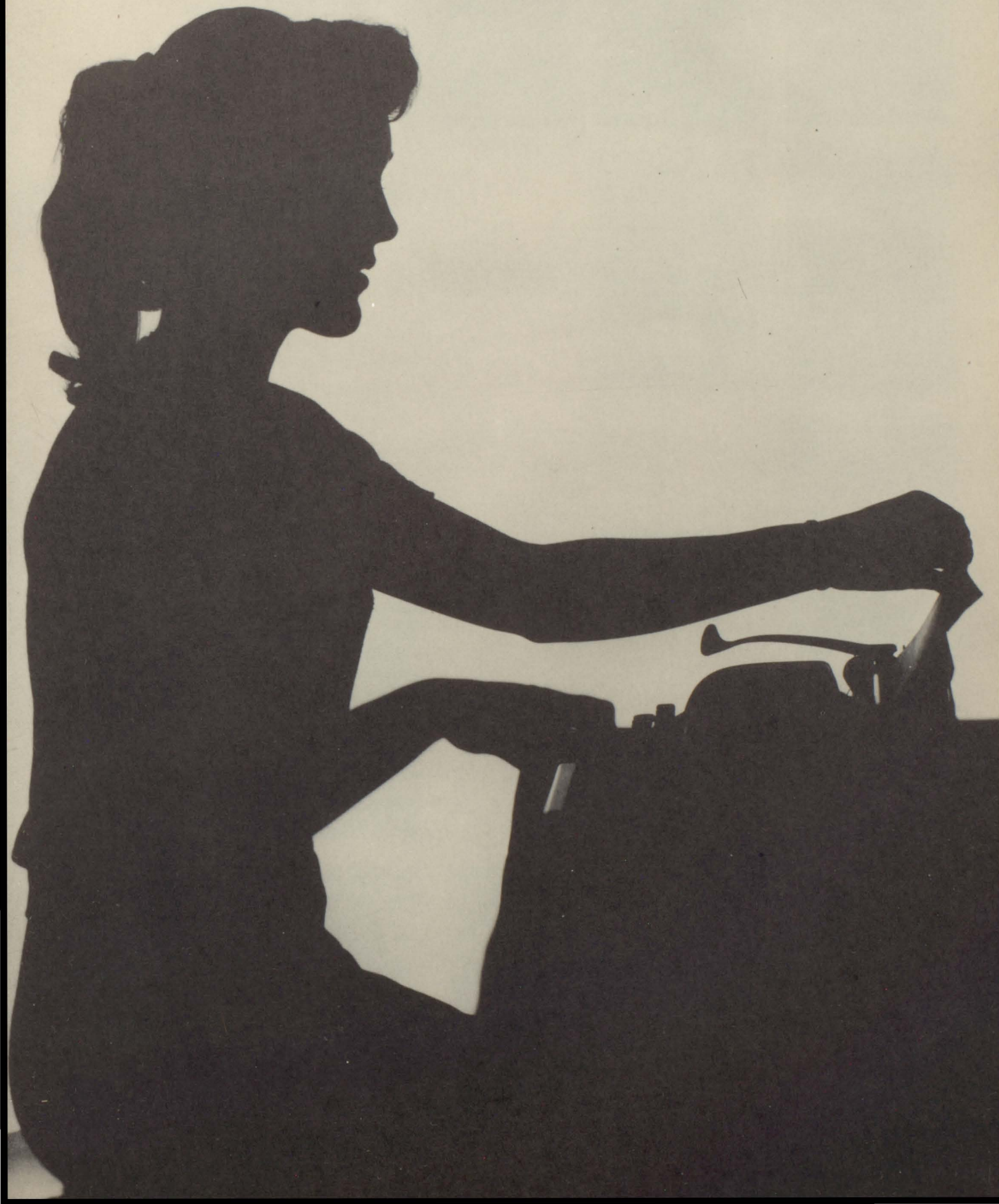
Doris Hancock wills her love for Waddletown boys with the exception of one to Evelyn Ingram and Norma Sue Hall.
